A fin-gerprint mutilation segment is shown on how criminals try to disguise identification. We will play a Myth vs Fact game to determine your understanding of evidence and questions are encouraged for this unique oppor-tunity to ask a forensic scientist those tricky questions. Our instructor, Lynne Dean, was a Latent Fingerprint Examiner for 35 l/2 years at King County Sheriff, Seattle, Washington and has qualified as a Forensic Scientist. For over 9 years she has instructed a 5 credit Fingerprint Science Class at Green River College in Washing-ton. She has also attended FBI Police Academy, Quantico, Virginia for a 3 week course in comparison of fin-gerprints. After spending over half her life in the field of fingerprints, crime scenes, and processing evidence, fingerprints have become a literal part of her. Her enthusiasm for work in the field of fingerprint forensics comes through during her presentations.

Violent Intruder Training

The goal of this training is to prepare community members to respond to an active shooter threat in the workplace using techniques and practices that have been demonstrated to greatly improve your odds of survival. This course is designed to teach proactive option based survival strategies that can easily be employed in order to bridge that critical gap from the beginning of a violent event until the arrival of law enforcement. A proactive option based response to an active shooter event is now recommended by the US Department of Homeland Security and the US Department of Education, as well as numerous state and local law enforcement agencies. Class Instructors bring a combined 55 years of prior law enforcement experience. You must register to attend.


