PAYMENT AND REFUNDS

Registration and payment of each class is required at the time of registration. We MUST have a 48 hour notice if you are canceling your registration for a program. Any cancellations made within 48 hours of the class will NOT be refunded. Phone reservations will not be accepted. If a class is canceled you will receive a full refund for the amount of the class fee.

Registration forms and payment are required by the deadline to ensure a spot in the activity. These deadlines allow us to make important decisions regarding the class, staffing and facilities. R Recreation does not save spots for any programs without proper registration and payment of fees.
