Any cancellations made within 48 hours of the class will NOT be refunded. Phone reservations will not be accepted. If a class is canceled you will receive a full refund for the amount of the class fee.

Class Costs

In this brochure you will notice that the cost of our classes have increased. In addition to the rising cost of supplies, we were recommended by our online vendor to be proactive to align with evolving legal requirements from the Federal Trade Commission for convenience fee transparency. The convenience fee has been absorbed into the cost of each class.

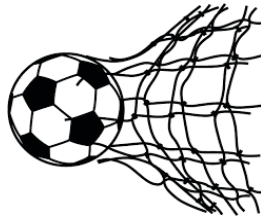

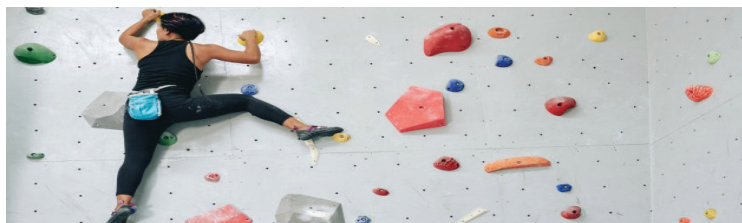

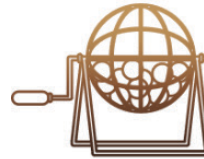
